<p>Blue Fescue <i>Festuca glauca</i></p>  	<p>6-12 inches tall 6-12 inches wide</p>	<p>Semi-Evergreen Hardy to minus 15 degrees</p>	<p>Unique grass with blue blades. Wispy flower spikes are pale yellow to tan.</p>	
<p>Velevit Forest Sedge <i>Carex 'Velevit Humilis'</i></p>  	<p>6-12 inches tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen Hardy to minus 10 degrees</p>	<p>Compact, low-growing grass that resembles a mop head of green hair. Handles some foot traffic.</p>	
<p>Japanese Blood Grass <i>Imperata cylindrica</i></p> 	<p>1-2 feet tall 12-18 inches wide</p>	<p>Deciduous Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Showy grass that has green blades with bright red tips. Excellent as border, in a container, or in mass planting. Can be invasive and spread freely in wet area.</p>	

<p>Oriental Fountain Grass <i>Pennisetum orientale</i></p> 	<p>1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide</p> <p>*Pennisetum 'Karley Rose' grows slightly larger and has pinkish flower spikes</p>	<p>Deciduous</p> <p>Hardy to minus 5 degrees</p>	<p>Clumping grass with green blades. Showy white flower spikes in summer.</p>	
<p>Orange Sedge <i>Carex testacea</i></p>  	<p>1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to 5 degrees</p>	<p>Forms cascading mound of narrow, arching olive green which turn coppery-brown in summer and have orange tints in winter.</p>	
<p>Little Bluestem <i>Schizachyrium scoparium</i></p> 	<p>2-3 feet tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Semi-evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to minus 25 degrees</p>	<p>Upright blue-green grass gets tinged purple in colder weather. Tan-colored seed heads rise 1-2 feet above foliage in fall.</p>	
<p>Little Miss Maiden Grass <i>Miscanthus sinensis 'Little Miss'</i></p> 	<p>2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet wide</p>	<p>Deciduous</p> <p>Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Graceful grass with lush green blades that emerge in spring. Turns brilliant red with purple tones in fall. Showy buff colored seed heads in late summer.</p>	

<p>Pink Muhly Grass <i>Muhlenbergia capillaris</i></p> 	<p>2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet wide</p> <p>*there are varieties of this grass that grow taller or bloom white</p>	<p>Semi-Evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Attractive green grass. Clouds of pink flowers in fall resemble cotton candy. Low water needs once established.</p>	
<p>Karl Foerster Feather Reed Grass <i>Calamagrostis 'Karl Foerster'</i></p> 	<p>4-5 feet tall 2-3 feet wide</p> <p>*Calamagrostis 'Overdam' has similar look, but slightly smaller and is variegated with green and white striped blades</p>	<p>Deciduous</p> <p>Hardy to minus 10 degrees</p>	<p>Tall growing grass with green, flowing blades. Feathery tan plumes in summer.</p>	
<p>Chinese Silver Grass <i>Miscanthus sinensis 'Morning Light'</i></p> 	<p>4-6 feet tall 3-4 feet wide</p>	<p>Deciduous</p> <p>Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Award-winning grass with vase-like shape and fine-textured foliage that sways gracefully in the breeze. Ivory variegation makes it look silver from a distance. Showy pink-red plumes in late summer.</p>	
<p>Zebra Grass <i>Miscanthus sinensis 'Zebrinus'</i></p> 	<p>5-7 feet tall 4-6 feet wide</p> <p>*Miscanthus sinensis 'Little Zebra' has similar look but only grows 3-4 feet tall & wide</p>	<p>Deciduous</p> <p>Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Distinctive ornamental grass with unusual variegation that resembles zebra stripes! Horizontal yellow rings on arching green blades. Pinkish-copper plumes in late summer.</p>	

<p>Pampas Grass <i>Cortaderia selloana</i></p> 	<p>8-10 feet tall 6-8 feet wide</p> <p>*dwarf variety grows to 5-6 feet tall and wide</p>	<p>Evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to 10 degrees</p>	<p>Clumping green grass grows very large. Graceful, fluffy white plumes begin in summer.</p> <p>This grass is very invasive on the CA coast, but not in our colder climate.</p>

→ this symbol indicates plants that can survive drought once established. It typically takes 1-2 years of regular water for a new plant to be established. In general, plants look better with regular water, but drought-tolerant plants can survive times when water is not available.










→ this symbol indicates plants that are considered fire-wise, meaning that they are more resistant to wildfire due to their growth habits. Plants with this symbol were found online in lists of 'fire safe' plants.

Plant Name	Height & Spread	Evergreen or Deciduous	Description	Photo
California Meadow Sedge <i>Carex pansa</i>  	6-8 inches tall 2-3 feet wide	Evergreen Hardy to 10 degrees	Low, spreading grass with wild meadow look. Best look with low water and no mowing. Slender, cream to golden flowers in spring. Drought-tolerant once established.	
Creeping Red Fescue <i>Festuca 'Molate'</i>  	12-18 inches tall 12-18 inches wide	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees or below	Soft, flowing drifts of blue-grey-green foliage. Buff colored flower spikes rise 2-3 feet high in summer. Can be mowed to 2 inches tall.	
Tufted Hair Grass <i>Deschampsia cespitosa</i> 	18-24 inches tall 12-18 inches wide	Semi-evergreen Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Finely textured, clumping grass. Narrow, dark green blades. Airy, light green florets in summer. Low water needs once established.	
Purple Needlegrass <i>Stipa pulchra</i>  	1-3 feet tall 1-2 feet wide	Deciduous Hardy to 5 degrees	Bunch grass with blades that are bright green up close, appear grey from a distance. Airy cream flowers with hints of purple in late summer. Drought-tolerant once established.	

<p>California Gray Rush <i>Juncus patens</i></p> 	<p>2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet wide</p> 	<p>Evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Dense clumps of narrow, erect, gray-green to gray-blue, leafless stems. Flowers are small, golden-brown, and tassel-like clusters. Blooms spring and early summer. Can live in water but also tolerates very dry conditions.</p>	
<p>Deer Grass <i>Muhlenbergia rigens</i></p> 	<p>2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet wide</p>	<p>Semi-evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to 5 degrees</p>	<p>Dense clump of slender arching green blades. Tan flower spikes above foliage in fall. Plumes can reach 5 feet tall. Drought-tolerant once established.</p>	
<p>California Fescue <i>Festuca californica</i></p> 	<p>3-5 feet tall 2-4 feet wide</p> 	<p>Evergreen</p> <p>Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Loose clump of blue-green or blue-grey leaves. Graceful, fountain-like habit. Drought-tolerant once established.</p>
