<p>Variegated Sweetflag <i>Acorus gramineus</i> 'Ogon'</p> 	<p>8-12 inches tall 8-12 inches wide</p>	<p>Semi-evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Bright yellow variegated foliage is sweetly fragrant when bruised. Tiny yellow-green flowers in summer give way to small, reddish berries.</p>	
<p>Mondo Grass <i>Ophiopogon japonicus</i></p>	<p>10-12 inches tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen Hardy to 10 degrees</p>	<p>Dark green arching blades. Forms dense mound. Purple flower spikes in summer followed by purple berries in fall.</p>	
<p>Black Mondo Grass <i>Ophiopogon japonicas</i> 'Nigra'</p>	<p>10-12 inches tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen Hardy to 10 degrees</p>	<p>Unique, purple-black arching blades. Forms dense mound. Lavender flower spikes in summer followed by purple berries in fall.</p>	

<p>Royal Purple Lily Turf <i>Liriope muscari 'Royal Purple'</i></p> 	<p>12-18 inches tall 12-18 inches wide</p>	<p>Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Grass-like green blades year-round. Spikes of deep purple flowers rise above foliage in summer. Also available variegated with green and white blades – Liriope 'Silvery Sunproof'</p>	
<p>Gold Band Sedge <i>Carex 'Gold Band'</i></p> 	<p>12-18 inches tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Narrow, deep green blades variegated with golden margins which fade to white. Brownish flower spikes in summer are short-lived and inconspicuous.</p>	
<p>Japanese Forest Grass <i>Hakonechloa macra 'Aureola'</i></p>	<p>1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide</p>	<p>Deciduous, melts to ground for winter Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Attractive, graceful grass with bright yellow foliage. Tall and arching habit. Also available with variegated green/yellow blades – Hakonechloa 'Aureola'</p>	
<p>Everillo Sedge <i>Carex 'Everillo'</i></p> 	<p>1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide *there are varieties of this grass that grow taller or bloom white</p>	<p>Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees</p>	<p>Lime green foliage matures to bright, golden yellow. In sunnier spots, yellow intensifies. In extreme shade, foliage is more chartreuse. Nice pop of color in shade garden.</p>	



→ this symbol indicates plants that can survive drought once established. It takes 1-2 years of regular watering for a plant to be fully established. In general, plants will look better with regular water, but drought-tolerant plants can survive times when water is not available.

<p>Creeping Red Fescue <i>Festuca rubra</i> 'Molate'</p> 	12-18 inches tall 12-18 inches wide	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees or below	Soft, flowing drifts of blue-grey-green foliage. Buff colored flower spikes rise 2-3 feet high in summer. Can be mowed to 2 inches tall.	
<p>California Gray Rush <i>Juncus patens</i></p> 	1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide	Evergreen Hardy to 15 degrees	Thin, rounded, grey-green leafless stems. Inconspicuous golden-brown flower clusters below the leaf tips from spring to fall. Very tough – can grow in very dry or very wet area.	
<p>Purple Needlegrass <i>Stipa pulchra</i></p> 	1-3 feet tall 1-2 feet wide	Deciduous Hardy to 5 degrees	Bunch grass with blades that are bright green up close, appear grey from a distance. Airy cream flowers with hints of purple in late summer. Drought-tolerant once established.	
<p>Deer Grass <i>Muhlenbergia rigens</i></p> 	2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet wide	Semi-evergreen Hardy to 5 degrees	Dense clump of slender arching green blades. Tan flower spikes above foliage in fall. Plumes can reach 5 feet tall. Drought-tolerant once established.
