Mondo Grass Ophiopogon japonicus	10-12 inches tall 1-2 feet wide	Evergreen Hardy to 10 degrees	Dark green arching blades. Forms dense mound. Purple flower spikes in summer followed by purple berries in fall.	
Black Mondo Grass Ophiopogon japonicas 'Nigra'	10-12 inches tall 1-2 feet wide	Evergreen Hardy to 10 degrees	Unique, purple-black arching blades. Forms dense mound. Lavender flower spikes in summer followed by purple berries in fall.	

Royal Purple Lily Turf Liriope muscari 'Royal Purple'	12-18 inches tall 12-18 inches wide	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees	Grass-like green blades year-round. Gold Band Sedge Carex 'Gold Band' DROUGHT TOLERANT Once established	12-18 inches tall 1-2 feet wide	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees	Narrow, deep green blades variegated with golden margins which fade to white. Brownish flower spikes in summer are short-lived and inconspicuous.	
Japanese Forest Grass Hakonechloa macra 'Aureola'	1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide	Deciduous, melts to ground for winter Hardy to 0 degrees	Attractive, graceful grass with bright yellow foliage. Tall and arching habit. Also available with variegated green/yellow blades – Hakenochloa 'Aureola'	
Everillo Sedge Carex 'Everillo'	1-2 feet tall 1-2 feet wide *there are varieties of this grass that grow taller or bloom white	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees	Lime green foliage matures to bright, golden yellow.
